## New Website and Discover Search Coming Soon

The HAM-TMC Library will soon present a new face, with new features, to our user community. We will inaugurate an updated website soon; one that will provide more than the cosmetic changes that will be immediately noticed.



One of the most innovative features is the prominent

**"Discover" search box**, which allows the user to enter search terms once, wait a few seconds and receive results drawn from several different resources, including PubMed, Science Direct, Scopus, and the Library catalog. This new search tool retrieves results by adapting itself to the search conventions of each separate database, translating the data, and presenting it as a list and as subject clusters.

## FIND IT! PubMed – Your Links are Changing

Soon HAM-TMC Library's icons for print and electronic holdings, visible when viewing abstracts of available online articles in PubMed, will disappear. The Library recently activated the Find It! Button – the one you may have noticed and clicked on in other databases is now in PubMed. This change will allow us to bring you more accurate information on the full-text options available for each online article or chapter. At a glance, you can see an item's multiple online locations with date ranges; link to the catalog entry; or order photocopies and Interlibrary Loans for materials we can't provide – all without interrupting your research. The Find It! Button (powered by Article Linker) sits in the top right corner of all fully processed PubMed abstracts.

## New Nursing Database

ProQuest Nursing and Allied Health is one of the newest Library database subscriptions, it includes 683 full-text journals focusing on nursing and allied health professions, including physical therapy, radiography, dietetics, dental hygiene and clinical laboratory sciences. This database is particularly useful for students and faculty interested in Evidence-based Practice (EBP) as it includes EBP content from the Joanna Briggs Institute.



The Library has at the same time subscribed to ProQuest Health Management, a health business database focused on healthcare systems and healthcare administration, policy, economics, ethics, and law.

Access to ProQuest Nursing and Allied Health and ProQuest Health Management is available to Educational and Clinical Partner users.
